1) FORMULATION OF POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS



Q 1: Prioritizing the agricultural trade rationalization options.

Agricultural trade policy rationalization options	Rank
Regional agricultural trade agreements (trade agreements with agricultural preferential market Access provisions)	1
Regional economic communities (agreements with broad economic cooperation with/without preferential market access provisions)	2
Preferential regional trade agreements (trade agreements with agricultural preferential market access provisions)	3
Preferential trade agreements (trade agreements with preferential agricultural market access provisions)	3
Bilateral trade agreements (agreements between two trading parties with agricultural preferential market access provisions)	3
Product-based commodity trade agreements (bilateral or multilateral, intra- or inter-regional agreements with preferential market access provisions)	4
Collaborative agricultural policy liberalization (at multilateral level of WTO or unilaterally)	5

Q2: The areas of agricultural trade policies where trade rationalization efforts must be focused on.

Agricultural trade policy areas	Rank
Non-tariff measures – Sanitary and phytosanitary measures	1
Trade facilitation	2
Non-tariff measures – Technical barriers to trade measures	3
Physical connectivity including trade transportation modes and cross-border connectivity	4
Tariff measures	5
Quality & certification including geographical indications and halal certifications	5

Q3: The priority areas where trade rationalization efforts for reducing agricultural trade costs must be focused on.

Items for reducing agricultural trade costs	Rank
Market access analysis	1
Institutional/administrative capacity development	2
Agricultural business cooperation and policy coordination platforms	2
Trade potential analysis	3
Organizing buying missions	4
Mutual recognition agreements including regional and/or OIC level approximations	5
Trade fairs	6



3- ROOM DOCUMENT

Policy Advice 1

• Developing and implementing preferential market access schemes and intra- as well as cross-regional trade agreements (e.g. TPS-OIC (Trade Preferential System among the Member States of the OIC)) with a view to contributing to collaborative and inclusive agricultural trade integration.

Policy Advice 2

 Building supply-side capacity and rationalizing nontariff measures (NTMs) for a sustained agricultural trade structure among OIC member countries.
