





Promoting value addition and productivity in agriculture


- Horizontal: economy-wide policies
 - Ensure macroeconomic stability
 - Invest in human capital
 - Improve infrastructure
- Targeted: measures directed at specific sector or issue
 - Strengthen market access for smallholders
 - Support innovation
 - Facilitate access to finance


Regional and international cooperation


- Reduce trade barriers
- Lower transaction costs
- Strengthen regional value chains




Intra-African agricultural trade







Intra-African agricultural trade



African Continental Free Trade Area

- Establish single continental market
- Boost intra-African trade
- Consolidate regional FTAs
- Promote regional integration



Intra-African regional cooperation

- Create regional market places: e.g. Mombasa Tea Auction
- Strengthen regional infrastructure: e.g. Maputo Development Corridor
- Develop cross-border mobile payment systems: e.g. Burkina
 Faso-Cote d'Ivoire, Tanzania-Rwanda mobile-to-mobile service
