




Instruments of the COMCEC Strategy





- CCO issues a call for project proposals
- POs submit their preliminary proposals to the CCO
- CCO makes preliminary appraisal and declares the short list on COMCEC website
- Short-listed POs submit the <u>final</u> version of project fiche to the CCO
- CCO evaluates the final project proposals
- CCO declares the final list of projects on COMCEC website



Common Characteristics of Successful Project Proposals

- Sufficient and informative project summary
- Sound project activities and relevant details about them
- Qualified Human Resources in line with Project Submission Guidelines Requirements
- Detailed and well-designed work plan
- Realistic cost estimations in the budget and sufficient explanations for them

Project Title: Enhancing National Capacities of OIC Member Countries in Poverty Statistics

Project Owner: SESRIC

Project Purpose: was to highlight the nature and causes of poverty and to formulate strategies for strengthening capacities in the compilation, production and dissemination of poverty statistics. By that Project aims at contributing to the national statistical systems (NSS) of the OIC countries in terms of poverty alleviation, monitoring of poverty and aid effectiveness.

Activities: Questionnaire design, circulation, and evaluation of the survey results, organization of two meetings in collaboration with the COMCEC Poverty WG with the participation of experts from NSOs in order to draw the outline of the policy-oriented a research paper, drafting and publishing of the research paper on the subject matter.





Project Title: : Design and Implementation of the Management Information System for SSN's in COMCEC Member States.

Project Owner: Ministry of Social Affairs and Housing of Suriname

Partner Countries: Turkey and Guyana

Project Purpose: was to build capacity to design a Management Information System for the Social Security Net Programs of the governments of Suriname and Guyana in collaboration with Turkey.

Activities: Data collection (including site visits), desk based analysis for collected data, drafting and presenting of the monitoring and evaluation report, dissemination of the final report.





Project Title: Building Productivity Capacities of Agriculture Small Scale Producers of the Coffee and Cocoa within Cameroon, Nigeria and Benin through the Improvement of Phytosanitary Practices.

Project Owner: Ministry of Finance of Cameroon

Partner Countries: Nigeria and Benin

Project Purpose: was to train coffee/cocoa producers and other chain stakeholders (staff of the Ministries of Agriculture and Rural Development) and to train farm input distributors on good phytosanitary practices in Cameroon, Nigeria and Benin in order to improve their productive capacities.

Activities: Data collection and analyses in Cameroon, study visits to Nigeria and Benin, preparation of the training manuals, organization of the training seminar and awareness on good plant protection for the chain






Project Title: Improving Statistical Capacities of OIC Member Countries in Poverty Statistics.

Project Owner: SESRIC

Project Purpose: was to conduct a series of short term capacity building and training programmes in poverty statistics based on the statistical capacities and needs identified through the questionnaire circulated under the 2013-SESRIC-028 project and organizing a workshop on poverty statistics with the participation of national and international experts.

Activities: Selection of countries, organization of training programmes, organization of a workshop, evaluations on training programmes and the workshop, analysis on evaluations, drafting of the evaluation report and publication of the evaluation report.





Project Title: The Role of Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) in Poverty Reduction: A Comparative Study among Iran, Malaysia, and Indonesia

Project Owner: Ministry of Cooperative, Labor and Social Welfare of Iran


Partner Countries: Malaysia and Indonesia


Project Purpose: was to identify the best practices for reducing poverty within CBR programs, creating database, raising awareness for policy makers in the COMCEC Member Countries, enhancing the understanding of CBR's managers and workers regarding CBR activities toward alleviating poverty.

Activities: Preparation of terms of reference of the project, review of the existing literature, data collection for a comparative analysis on different CBR programs, seminar/workshop.









Partner Countries: Malaysia, Turkey and Bangladesh



Project Purpose: was to develop model of local community-based poverty alleviation for the poor in country border and backward areas.

Activities: Data collection and analyses, study visits, organization of workshop, preparation of the project report
