




Profile

- Shortage in demand for oil.




Evolution of Active Covid-19 Related Policies on Medical Sector

Online Survey

- The Questionnaire was prepared in 4 languages:
 - ✓ English,
 - ✓ Arabic,
 - ✓ French and
 - ✓ Turkish
- E-mail requests for their participation in the Survey were sent to a total of 1995 stakeholders' / key informants' addresses in;
 - A total of 49 OIC Countries registered with the COMCEC Trade Working Group,
 - > 981 in 20 Arab Group countries,
 - > 507 in Africa Group countries and
 - > 507 in Asia Group countries



Online Survey

- * A total of 25 OIC Countries responded, as follows:
 - 9 countries from Arab Group
 - > 7 countries from Africa Group
 - 9 countries from Asia Group
