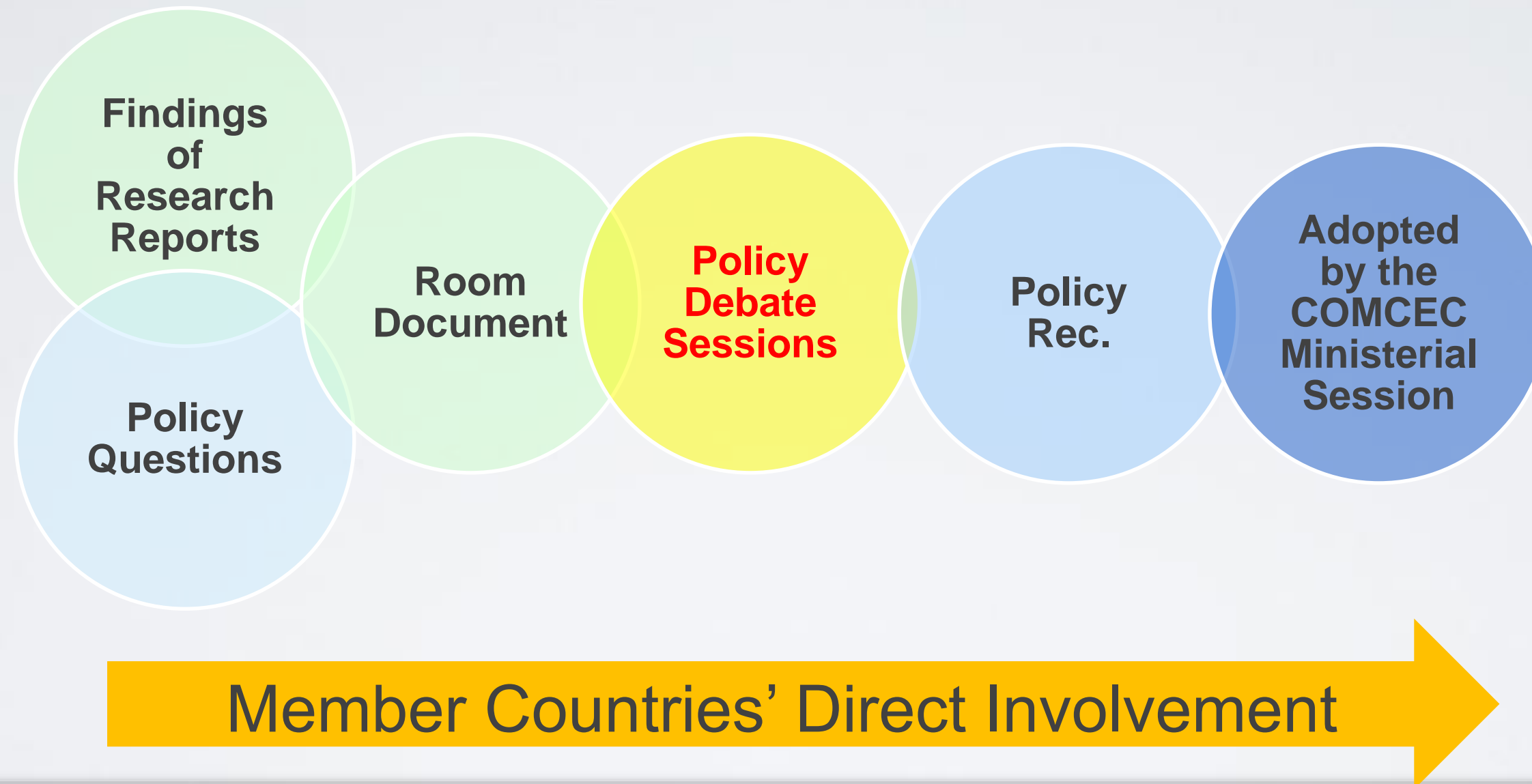
1) FORMULATION OF POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS

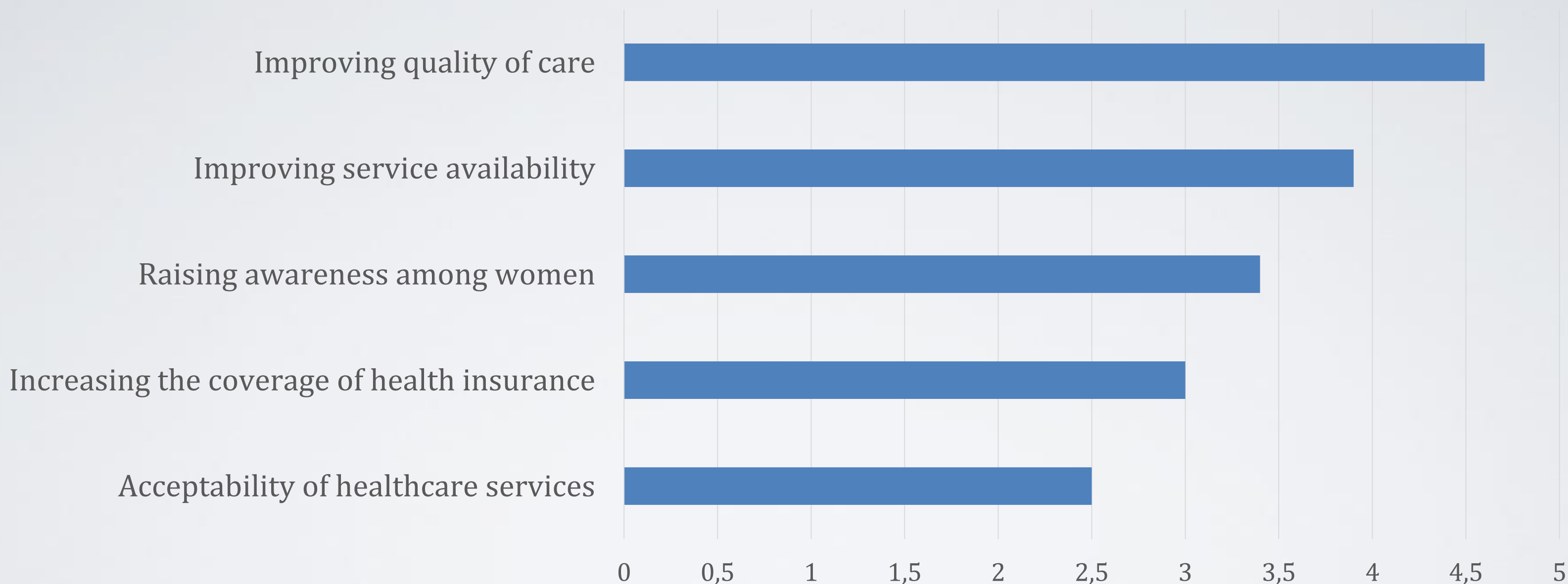
Q1. Is there any significant programme/national strategy/action plan that has reduced child and maternal mortality rates in your country?

- Emergency Obstetric Care Program(Turkey)

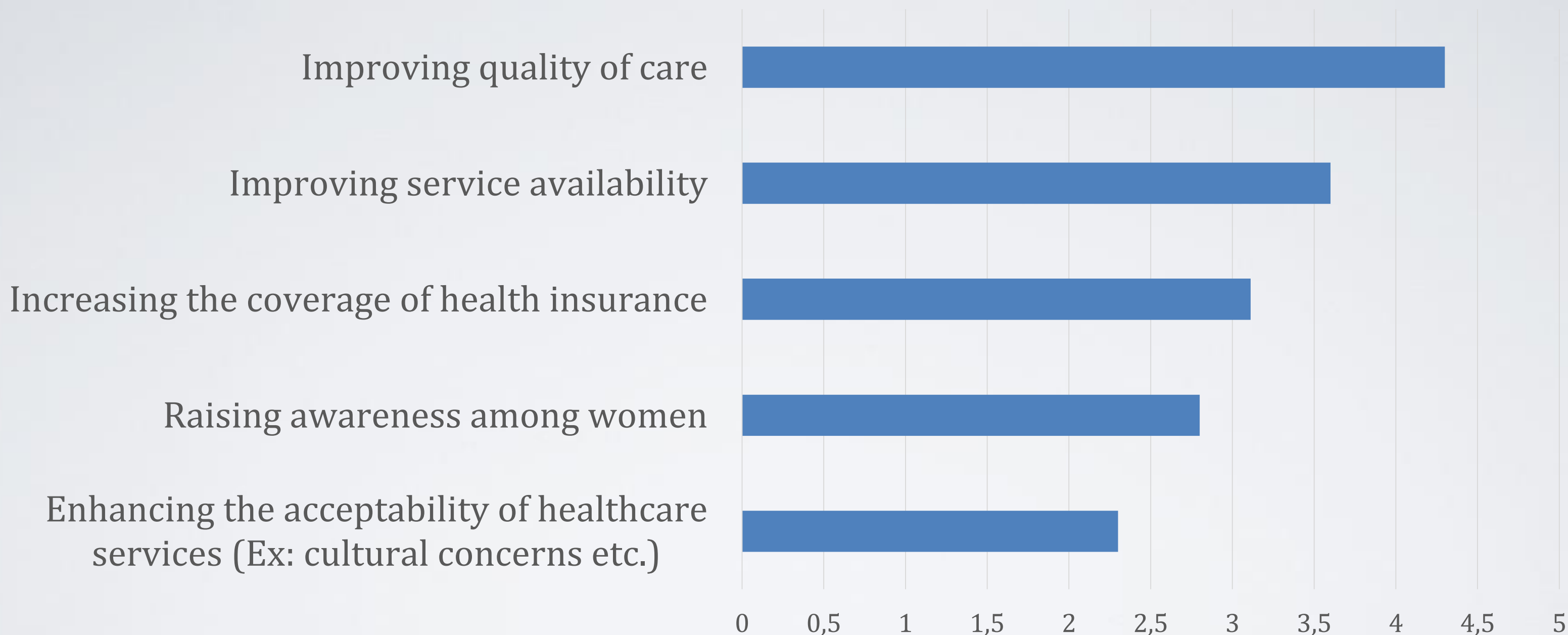

Q2. Which of the following policy actions would help families to seek delivery care from a skilled provider or a facility in your country?



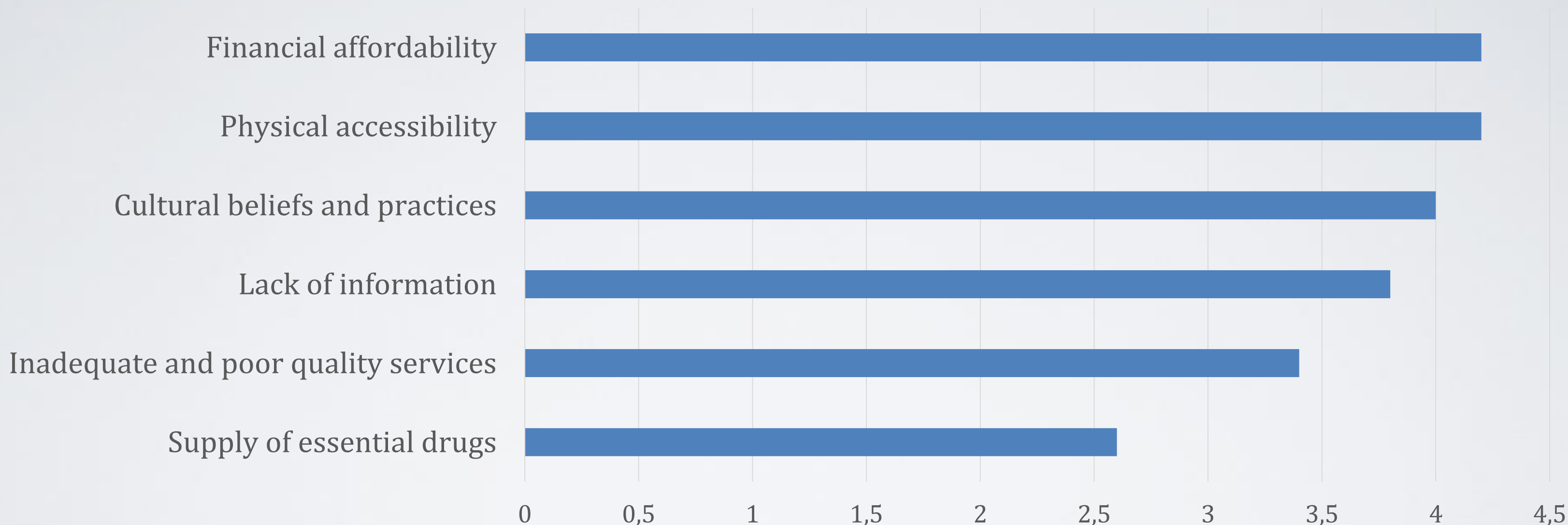

Q3. In terms of budget allocation, what is the order of magnitude for each factor?



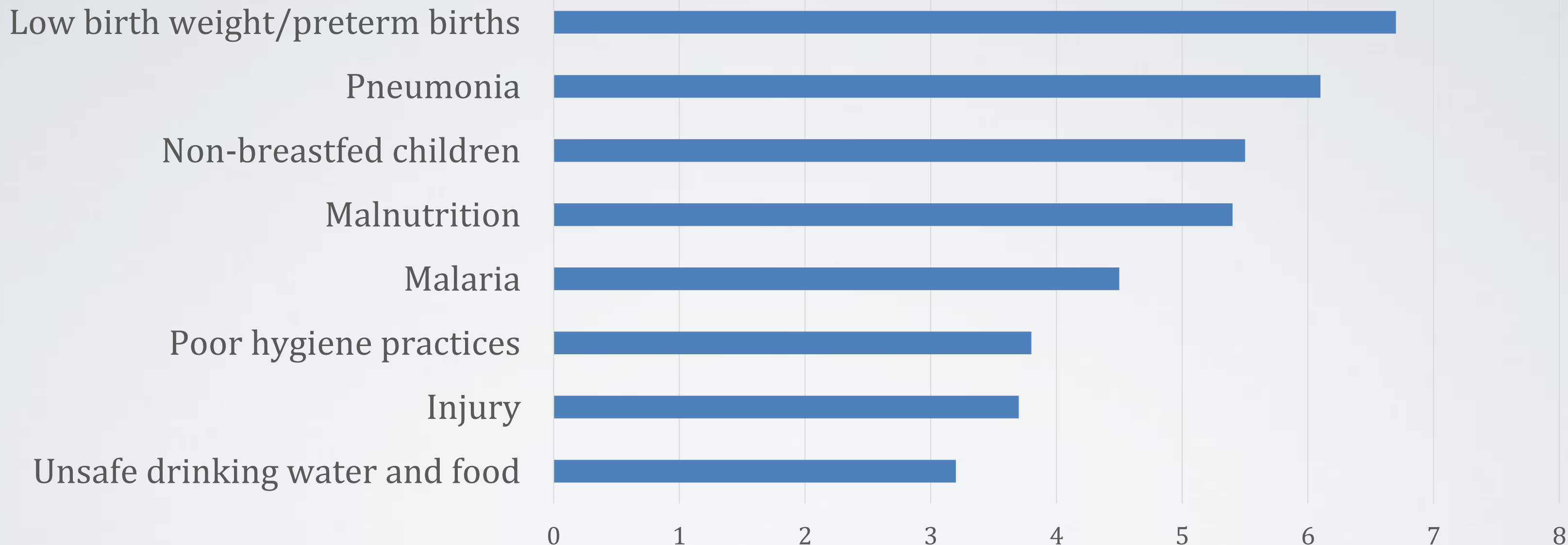

Contribution of International Actors

- Technical and financial support of UN Agencies (awareness-raising activities, carrying out studies and surveys) (Algeria)
- Financial and technical assistance by UNFPA, GIZ, WHO and UNICEF (strengthening the technical platform of health facilities, development and dissemination of data collection) (Cameroon)
- Support of NGOs in financing and implementing projects (Palestine)

2- Policy Questions and Member Countries' Responses

Q7. Which policies should be prioritized to meet SDGs on child and maternal mortality in your country?

- Support for perinatal care and prenatal consultation (Algeria)
- Social protection services, clinical capacity building, and monitoring evaluation (Indonesia)
- Training of healthcare providers, providing adequate medical equipment and supply (Palestine)
- Monitoring of women aged 15-49, Prenatal Care, Postnatal Care services (Turkey)

3- Room Document- Policy Recommendations

Policy Recommendation 1

- Developing a strategy/policy to improve access to maternal, neonatal and child health (MNCH) care, and to provide equitable distribution of health providers

Policy Recommendation 2

- Improving health system functioning and quality of MNCH care through training and practice of recommended standard of care protocols, and regular monitoring of standards

Policy Recommendation 3

- Improving continuum of maternal, neonatal and child health care for assuring uninterrupted services during pregnancy, delivery and postpartum period

Policy Recommendation 4

- Developing/Improving health information management systems for monitoring MNCH care level and reporting births and deaths, including maternal deaths, nationally and locally
