




Main Factors Accounting for the Weakness of OIC Exports in 2014

- The slow pace of world demand growth
- Collapse in oil prices
- Falling prices for other primary commodities
- Ongoing political instability in the Middle East




World trade growth remained sluggish in 2014








Growth performance was especially weak in Emerging Economies




Non-fuel Commodity Prices Have Been Declining







Share of OIC countries in global exports have been declining since 2012








Top performers as a whole accounts for 76 per cent of total OIC exports

Top Exporter Countries in 2014, Billion Dollars



High country concentration in total OIC exports




Dominance of mineral fuels and oils in total OIC exports

Share of Petroleum in Total Exports, (%)



Share of Commodities in Total Exports, 2014 (%)






Malaysia, Turkey, United Arab Emirates and Indonesia are the largest manufactured goods exporters of OIC








43 per cent of total OIC manufactured goods exports consist of high-skill and technology-intensive manufactures




TOTAL OIC IMPORTS



Total OIC imports dominated by the leading exporters in 2014





Total OIC imports originated mainly from developed countries





Product diversification of total OIC imports was higher










Share of intra-OIC trade peaked at 18.9 per cent in 2014







Top performers in intra OIC trade in 2014



Top Sectors in Intra-OIC Exports






20 per cent intra-OIC trade target was surpassed by 30 Member States in 2014

Member States Having the Lowest Intra-OIC Trade Share (%)


