

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 21ST COMCEC AWG

• Project Funding for Strategic Commodities Development: IOFS request from the COMCEC AWG to consider allocating project funding for the development of strategic commodities like wheat, rice, or cassava, while emphasizing the importance of conducting country-level baseline studies in collaboration with IsDB to address specific challenges. It is crucial to leverage the resources and expertise value chain development initiatives to ensure sustainable progress in these strategic commodity development projects.

• 2. Support for Regional Consultations: IOFS also highlights the importance 49th CFM for its collaborative work with SESRIC and IsDB to prepare the "Strategy for Ensuring Food Security in OIC Member States" and requests COMCEC and other relevant AWG Members to support in engaging with Regional Consultations with Member States as

Sharing Outcomes of 2nd IO High-Level Forum: IOFS is willing to share the outcomes of the event with COMCEC AWG , as detailed in the Doha Communiqué, to facilitate knowledge exchange on agricultural technologies and related topics among member countries.
