Natural heritage sites carry cultural importance and enhance the holistic experience of heritage tourism.


Integration and Preservation

Architectural Heritage Database


The Prince Sultan bin Salman database catalogs hundreds of Islamic heritage sites, aiding research and tourism promotion.
